

Cricket Clinic / Sporting Schools

Over the past month, Howlong PS have participated in a Cricket Clinic funded by 'Sporting Schools' grant. Sporting Schools is an Australian Government initiative that seeks to promote interest in sport and develop confidence and capability to be active sportsman for life.

The school has received \$2700 to facilitate a cricket program. This has enabled the school to fund cricket coaches and cricket sessions for K-6 students. We were also able to use the funding to purchase new cricket equipment.

Through partnership with Cricket Australia, Robbie Mackinlay liaised with our school to deliver an engaging four week cricket program that helped develop students' skills in bowling, batting and fielding.
