Principal's Report

Safety strategies for children around dogs

There has been some minor incidences of children walking to school and coming across aggressive behaviour by dogs. Here are some useful tips that parents and carers can talk to their children about how they can keep themselves safe when dogs show aggressive behaviours.

What should children do around unfamiliar dogs?

- Ask permission to touch unfamiliar dogs.
- Give the dog a chance to approach, see and sniff them before touching.
- •Let the dog come to them instead of reaching for the dog.
- •Pet the dog only on the back and sides.
- •Speak to them in a calm voice.
- Back away if the dog looks nervous, moves away, freezes, snarls, growls or attempts to bite.

What should children do around familiar dogs?

- Give simple commands and praise the dog for compliance.
- Give treats (as permitted) when approaching the dog.
- •Command the dog to settle and relax in order to keep them calm (these are good commands to teach any dogs who live with children or are highly energetic).

What should children do when confronted by an aggressive dog?

- •If an aggressive dog approaches, stand very still and stay quiet "like a tree."
- •If knocked over, roll in a ball and lie still, "like a rock."
- •Immediately tell an adult about what happened.

Animals in Schools

Please ensure that all animals particularly dogs are kept on a short leash when dropping and picking up your child to and from school. Awareness of some students who are not confident around animals and for safety reasons need to be considered.

Section 14 of the Companion Animals Act (1998) prohibits dogs on schools grounds except where the principal gives permission. With the exception of working dogs, dogs must be kept on a leash in school grounds.

Any dog that has been declared dangerous under section 33 of the Companion Animals Act must not be allowed on school grounds. Thank you for your understanding.
