I would like to remind all parents that any decisions relating to class teachers are based on a range of school factors, taking into account the staffing mix available each year and whilst each request is considered we are not always able to guarantee all aspects of requests.

If any families are moving away next year we would appreciate notification to assist us with our planning for next year. Or if you are aware of new families moving into our district please ask them to notify us ASAP.

A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or if their family situation has changed. NSW Education Department Online Enrolment Project

We are excited to announce we will be are rolling out the new Online Enrolment System from Monday, 26 October 2020

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into **local** schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.



On Tuesday several teachers joined in a read-a-round. Teachers rotated around classes and read them one of their favourite books. Each class got to listen to 3 stories.






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Book Week Parade
