Check in Assessment for Years 3 and 5

Year 3 and Year 5 students have participated in a new reading and numeracy check-in assessment last week. The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor Years 3 & 5 student learning following the period of learning from home. The Check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.
