NAPLAN Online 2021

This year our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online for Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 from 11-21 May. This will mean that students will complete the NAPLAN Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy tests on computers, excluding the Year 3 Writing test which will still be delivered using paper. To find out more information about NAPLAN Online, visit www.nap.edu.au NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests.

School Reports

Reporting is the process of providing feedback to students, parents/carers and other teachers about student progress. End of semester one student reports will be available to parents at the end of week 9.

Teachers are currently assessing students learning for Terms 1 and 2 and will be using various forms of assessments to assist with their reporting.

A standards-referenced approach is used to report student achievement in NSW. Achievement standards are based on what students are expected to learn and how well they have achieved.

The NSW syllabuses state the intended learning for students by the end of each stage. A to E grade scales describe how well students have achieved. Teachers make professional on-balance judgements to decide which grade description best matches the standards their students have achieved at a particular point-in-time. These decisions are based on evidence of achievement and information teachers have collected during the teaching and learning.

If you have any concerns or would like to discuss the progress of your child's learning, please contact your child's class teacher to arrange an interview.

There will be an information session available in the coming weeks to provide parents and carers about what are standards, the A to E grade scale as well as our school's approaches in assessing and reporting on student learning and progress. The session will be advertised on Seesaw as well as our school newsletter in the next few weeks.
