We finished at about 1pm and then we had the presentations. Eight boys and four girls were selected for the NSW team. They will play in the Australian Primary Schools Interstate Championship being held in November in the ACT.

Austin finished highest for the Riverina team scoring equal 50th for scratch and equal 45th for nett. Isaac received the Riverina School Sports Association medal for his resilience and perseverance. Everyone had a crack and tried their best.

HOME READING FACT SHEET







Howlong Public School has a clear focus on phonics instruction in the classroom. We will be supporting this through **decodable sheets** sent home for home reading. These decodable sheets are based on the letter sequences that the student has learned in the classroom.

The aim of these sheets is to practice the sounds that these letters, or combination of letters, make, and to be able to blend (push the sounds together) or segment (break them into individual sounds) to promote fluency.

Examples of games and activities will be provided for parents to complete with your child/ren using these sheets. Short, regular, repeated practice will support your child to become flexible and fluent in their blending and segmenting of words, which assists both reading and writing. Students will be sent home new sheets once they have completed learning that letter sequence in class, which means that students may be bringing new decodable sheets home at different intervals.



Books will continue to be sent home to share and enjoy together once students reach a certain level of phoneme/grapheme ('code') knowledge. This will have a slightly different format than in the past. We will be classifying these books as 'You can' books. 'You can' books can be different types of text including story books from home, town or school library, magazines, newspapers and websites that you, as the parent, can read to, and with your child. Students will also be able to select books from school to take home as 'You can' books. They will be choosing them on the basis of their own interest rather than being concerned with the level of the book. These books can be recorded in the student's Home Reading Log.

This quality time with your child or children enables them to follow their own interests and instill a love of reading. There may be sections in these texts that your child can access on their own and begin to notice items of 'code' that they already know. They will also promote rich discussion and conversation about what is being read.




